Communication Protocols

Emergency Preparedness Kit:

Every household should have an emergency preparedness kit that includes:

- Water (one gallon per person per day for at least three days)
- Non-perishable food (at least a three-day supply)
- First aid kit
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio
- Whistle to signal for help

- Dust mask
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags, and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener for food
- Local maps
- Cash
- Copies of important documents (insurance policies, identification, etc.)

Community Preparedness Initiatives

- **Regular Drills:** We will conduct periodic drills to ensure everyone is familiar with the emergency procedures.
- **Emergency Preparedness Workshops:** We will organize workshops on topics like first aid, CPR, and disaster preparedness.
- **Neighborhood Watch Program:** We encourage residents to participate in the neighborhood watch program to enhance community safety.
